Companies can see a rise in accidents and injuries during the holidays due to the following factors:

Weather changes - Although minimal in Florida, temperature changes can impact work and employees may have insufficient clothing to work in colder temperatures Stress – The holidays can increase stress related to family and financial concerns causing distractions or stress that might impact employees focus on the job and put them at risk for not following proper safety procedures

Seasonal Depression – Colder weather and less daylight hours, among other things, can cause an increase in depression that could also impact employees mood, behavior, and attention to hazards at work

Distraction - As the holidays draw near, employees are focused on their kid's activities, parties, out of town visitors, family gatherings, etc. and are excited to get their work done and participate in the fun events so they might be more distracted during work



Prioritizing Safety During the Holiday Season:
